#### BUILD HOPE FOR THE FUTURE -- VOLUNTEER WITH MOCK TRIAL!

Holiday decorations are put away, days are cloudy and cold, and spring flowers are nowhere on the horizon. Rainy days and icy roads can put a damper on anyone's spirits. How can you overcome the mid-winter doldrums? A sure solution: investing in energetic, passionate young people – like the hundreds of high school students preparing to present their mock trial cases at our regional competitions!

On Saturday Feb. 2, more than 750 students – 96 teams! – will display their advocacy skills at nine locations across the state: Durham, Fayetteville, Gastonia, Greenville, Hendersonville, High Point, Raleigh, Salisbury, and Wilmington. For months, these dedicated students and their advisors have been analyzing case documents, learning the rules of evidence, creating compelling case theories and themes, and preparing

statements and examinations for a wrongful death lawsuit. Unlike real attorneys, they have to argue both

sides of the case! But every time, they will strive to present a winning case through their witnesses and attorneys.

In mock trial, students learn to reason cogently, communicate persuasively, and collaborate effectively. They develop self-confidence and leadership skills that will enable them to make a difference in the world. But you don't have to take my word for it!

Last year, April Espinosa from Forsyth county proclaimed, "I entered an entirely new world through Mock Trial. The competition taught me the foundation of real-world law in America, away from court portrayed in cinema and TV...it was clear that Mock Trial changed me for the better." She was not alone. The coach of a



homeschool team in Wake county noted that because of mock trial, "in just over a year, Austin [Massey] went from being a quiet and reserved team member to a confident and assured team leader."

**Robert Fensom of Fayetteville** would agree. "I have gained the confidence to be myself in every situation and to lead others to do the same. I attribute this transformation to the opportunities mock trial has given me. I can honestly say that this program has changed my life and given me skills I will continue to use in the future."

Perhaps Jessica Gross, our 2018 Widenhouse Leadership Award winner, summed it up best: "...mock trial has left a much bigger impact on me than I on it. It has given me confidence in my academic abilities, and my public speaking. I have found a love for law...that has shaped the way I want to contribute to the world in the future."
