LOOKING AHEAD AFTER AN UNHAPPY END

Two hours before North Carolina Governor Roy Cooper limited gatherings to less than 100 people in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, and one hour after the National High School Mock Trial Competition cancelled their national-level competition, the NC Mock Trial Program Board had to make the <u>tough decision</u> to also cancel the NCAJ High School Mock Trial State Finals competition to keep all mock trial students/coaches/volunteers and their families as safe as possible during an unprecedented time of uncertainty and risk.

We are very appreciative of how hard all mock trial students, including all State Finals competitors highlighted in the 2020 State Finals program, worked to prepare for competition and we recognize them all for their dedication and talent. We wish we could have ended their season differently and are already looking forward to next year. We will be unveiling a new mock trial scoring app, a new timely civil competition case, and new online team form submission processes to enhance the team experience. Plenty of 'mocking' to be done in the future.
