NCMTP BOARD CONFIRMS ONLINE COMPETITION FOR REGIONALS AND STATE FINALS IN 2021

The Board members of the North Carolina Mock Trial Program have analyzed the situation we are facing in North Carolina and have determined that <u>both</u> the NCAJ High School Mock Trial Regional and State Finals competitions will be held virtually in 2021. These decisions are designed to keep mock trial teams and families safe and give clear expectations for the full competition season. As noted in the calendar below, the regional competition will take place during the afternoon of February 5 and on Saturday, February 6 and State Finals will take place on March 5 and 6, 2021 on Zoom. Teams competing in Regionals will receive their mock trial sports bags, awards, and comment sheets in the mail and those participating in State Finals will receive their t-shirts, hats, awards and other materials immediately after March 6.
