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### **CASE CLARIFICATION #1**

Please note that there **is** a discrepancy in the retainer fee amount that Morgan Matthews paid to Pat Patel. Morgan statement has been **amended** to say that he/she paid **\$3,000.00** (Page 23) while Pat Patel says he/she received \$3,000.00 (Page 29). Also in Jordan Quick's witness statement (Page 49), he/she indicates that it was \$3,000.00.

Typos corrected:

- The day the “award-winning story” aired is 06/24/2021. Morgan’s affidavit was corrected to reflect this change (Page 22, Line 50).
- The day that Jordan was terminated is 06/23/2021. Morgan’s affidavit was corrected to reflect this change (Page 22, Lines 61-65).
- The word “second” was added to the Affidavit given by Jamie Chen (Page 33, Line 6).
- Please note that there is **not** a discrepancy in the number of hotel rooms that were booked. Morgan indicates that on June 19<sup>th</sup> and June 20<sup>th</sup> it was four each day (Page 23, Line 87) and Jordan indicates it was five each day (Page 49, Lines 110-112).
- In Exhibit 1, the phone number has been updated to reflect ten digits rather than nine.
- In Exhibit 8, the year for the date at the top has been updated to reflect 2021 rather than 2022.
