J.H. ROSE HIGH SCHOOL WINS STATE FINALS CHAMPIONSHIP AT THE NORTH CAROLINA ADVOCATES FOR JUSTICE HIGH SCHOOL MOCK TRIAL COMPETITION

This past Friday and Saturday, March 17-18, 2023, ten top teams from across North Carolina -- Village Christian Academy, Covenant Day School, Hendersonville High School, Gaston Christian School, Carrboro High School, Raleigh Charter High School, Central Carolina Homeschoolers, J.H. Rose High School, Wake Young Women's Leadership Academy, and Gray Stone Day School -- battled it out for the Title of "State Champion." After one preliminary round on Friday, and two preliminary rounds on Saturday, it came down to two teams: Carrboro High School versus J.H. Rose High School.

In the final championship round former N.C. Court of Appeals Judge Lucy Inman presided and jurors Mark Sumwalt, John McCabe, Janet Ward Black, Burton Craige, and Valerie Johnson scored outstanding performances by both teams. At the end of the day, J. H. Rose High School won the State Championship and will represent North Carolina at the National High School Mock Trial Championship in May hosted in Little Rock, Arkansas. COURTROOM ARTIST COMPETITION FINALIST

Four eager artists competed in the this years Courtroom Artist Competition! The competitors are assigned one team to sketch throughout the competition. At State Finals, competitors worked on their sketches in the first round and submitted their artwork on Saturday at the end of the second round. Drawings are done in colored pencils, pen and ink, pastel or markers. No watercolors or paint are allowed. The sketches are evaluated and scored anonymously by a judge or judging team. This year's State Champion is **Madalyn Bradley** with Covenant Day School. Madalyn has also earned the right to compete as a Courtroom Artist at the National High School Championship to be hosted in Little Rock, Arkansas. See Madalyn's finished artwork below.



M. Gordon Widenhouse Jr. Award for Inspirational Team Leadership

Each year the NCMTP has the privilege of awarding one senior participating in the NCAJ High School Mock Trial Competition with a scholarship which was established to honor the energy and commitment of the program's first chairperson, Gordon Widenhouse. The award recipient will not necessarily be a star witness or attorney, but he or she will be the person who held the team together throughout practices and competitions. Students are considered based on a written essay and recommendation of their teacher or attorney advisor.
